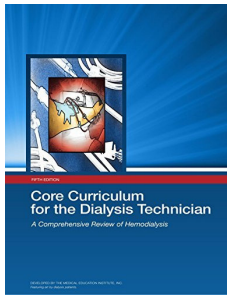

The basic hemodialysis training program is an entry-level training program that provides theory and practical instruction in the care and treatment of renal patients. This program leads to the occupations of Certified Hemodialysis Technician (CHT) or Hemodialysis trained nurse. The nurse specialty option is only available to those students who already hold a valid LPN/RN license.) The training program comprises 100+ hours of classroom and laboratory training, and 200+ hours of clinical externship training (for a total of 300+ training hours) in the fundamental aspects of hemodialysis.
